Revocable Lifetime Trust

- Example of the provisions of a revocable trust.
- * Assets in a revocable trust are not in the probate estate.
- ❖ No tax advantage to a revocable trust.
- ❖ A revocable trust is better than a durable power of attorney but does not replace a power of attorney.
- ❖ A revocable trust is usually not available to the public as is a Will.
