PROSPERITY

Prosperity is more than financial abundance; it applies to every area of life.

Definitions from Webster's dictionary:

Prosper: to succeed, thrive, flourish

Flourish:

- 1) To grow vigorously; succeed; thrive; prosper.
- 2) To be at the peak of development, activity, influence, production, etc.; be in one's prime.

Ps 92:13

Thrive: to grow vigorously or luxuriantly; improve physically.

Luxuriant: growing with vigor and in great abundance; lush; teeming. Synonym: profuse

Profuse:

- 1) giving or pouring forth freely; generous, often to the point of excess.
- 2) produced freely and abundantly.

See also plentiful. Having plenty - a full or more than adequate amount or supply. Antonym: limited, scant, spare

The blessing is the grace of God that enables man to fulfill the divine purpose.

Prospering is having an abundance of whatever is needed or desired.

Grace is the means by which God delivers that abundance.

GRACE

Webster's New International Dictionary (1917) defines grace (Theological) as:

- a) the divine unmerited favor toward man; the mercy of God as distinguished from His justice; also, any benefits His mercy imparts; divine love or pardon
- b) a state of acceptance with God; enjoyment of the divine favor; called more fully, *a state of grace*.
- c) A virtue or moral excellence regarded as coming from God; a Christian virtue; as the graces of self-denial, humility, meekness, temperance, peace, faith, love, etc.

This is the conventional view, and it derives from the Old Testament (Hebrew) meaning: Chen (pronounced khane) - graciousness, favor. From chanan - to bend or stoop in kindness to an inferior.

In the New Testament, *grace* in every case is the Greek word *charis*, which Strong's defines as follows:

Charis - graciousness of manner or act, abstract or concrete, literal, figurative or spiritual: especially, **the divine influence on the heart and its reflection in the life**
