with providing proper care, but experienced Christian Science nurses know that, at the heart of their work lies their practice of Christian Science. It is this spiritual understanding that can raise a simple task to a healing experience.

You will notice, too, that there is something that our Mission Statement does not include—any requirement that this care be provided within the four walls of our facility in Riverdale. Yes, our organization

is centered in New York and our beloved building provides an important base for all that we do. But we do not want it to limit our healing ministry.

We have been reaching, instead, to a more inspired perspective found in our textbook.

On page 258, Mary Baker Eddy writes, "God expresses in man the infinite idea forever developing itself, broadening and rising higher and higher from a boundless basis."

Following this higher calling, we have been offering our community expanded

opportunities for "loving Christian Science nursing care." We have reached outwards-making home visits to attend to a bandage or assist with a shower. We have welco med people to our doors in ways that some might not have thought of, such as for brief, planned stays to relieve families caring for loved ones. Of course, we continue to welcome "honest seekers," to quote Mrs. Eddy, to come as Rest and Study guests and immerse themselves in the healing atmosphere

of High Ridge House.

We believe this expanded expression of Christian Science nursing reflects a freshness of thought that meets the present need, and we are grateful to receive the support of the Christian Science community.

A local church member came by for lunch recently and remarked on the wonderful progress she could see with the care of our building. When we shared plans for future projects, she enthusiastically encouraged us to tell the field and allow others to share in the progress by contributing as each feels inspired. Our Wish List:

- New ceiling tiles for the hallways \$7,000.
- LED lights to replace the old flourescent tubes in public areas \$9,800.
- Shrubs to enhance privacy around outdoor dining area \$1,500.
- Remove tree that is leaning too far \$4,000.
- Repair cracks in brickwork near entrance that allow leaks during heavy rains \$9,500.
